My name is Jane Masilela. I am a single mother with two children: two girls and three grandchildren.

I started working at Nakekela on 2 May 2012 as a Home-based Care worker doing door-to-door in the community to raise awareness about Nakekela. Our team baths bed-bound patients and we educate families in caring for the sick.

I have experienced many challenges as a Home-based Care worker, including out-patients being in a denial stage and therefore not taking treatment, people not taking treatment properly, the passing of our out-patients and the lack of family support for patients who are HIV-positives.

The Word of God encourages me to be able to the work without fear. Trusting the Lord Jesus Christ helps us to be effective in our duties. We pray with patients and their families and that helps to encourage them not to lose hope.

I am grateful to be able to work at Nakekela as a Home-based Care worker because I am able to help people in the community. I am able to help outpatients to adhere to their treatment and when we see someone who is critically ill, we refer the person to be admitted at the centre. I have seen many of the patients getting better or their conditions improving. I encourage out-patients and families to read the Bible.

It is my prayer that the Lord continues to keep and bless Nakekela.
